We work in partnership with local organisations, including hospitals, universities and local NGOs, as well as like-minded international partners. Our mission is to 'repair bodies and rebuild lives' and we do this through providing surgical services to those who could not otherwise afford or access these, and by building the capacity of local medical systems (including rehabilitation services) through our training and mentoring programs, and through supporting the strengthening of hospitals and health systems.

Disability awareness and inclusion in the clinical setting

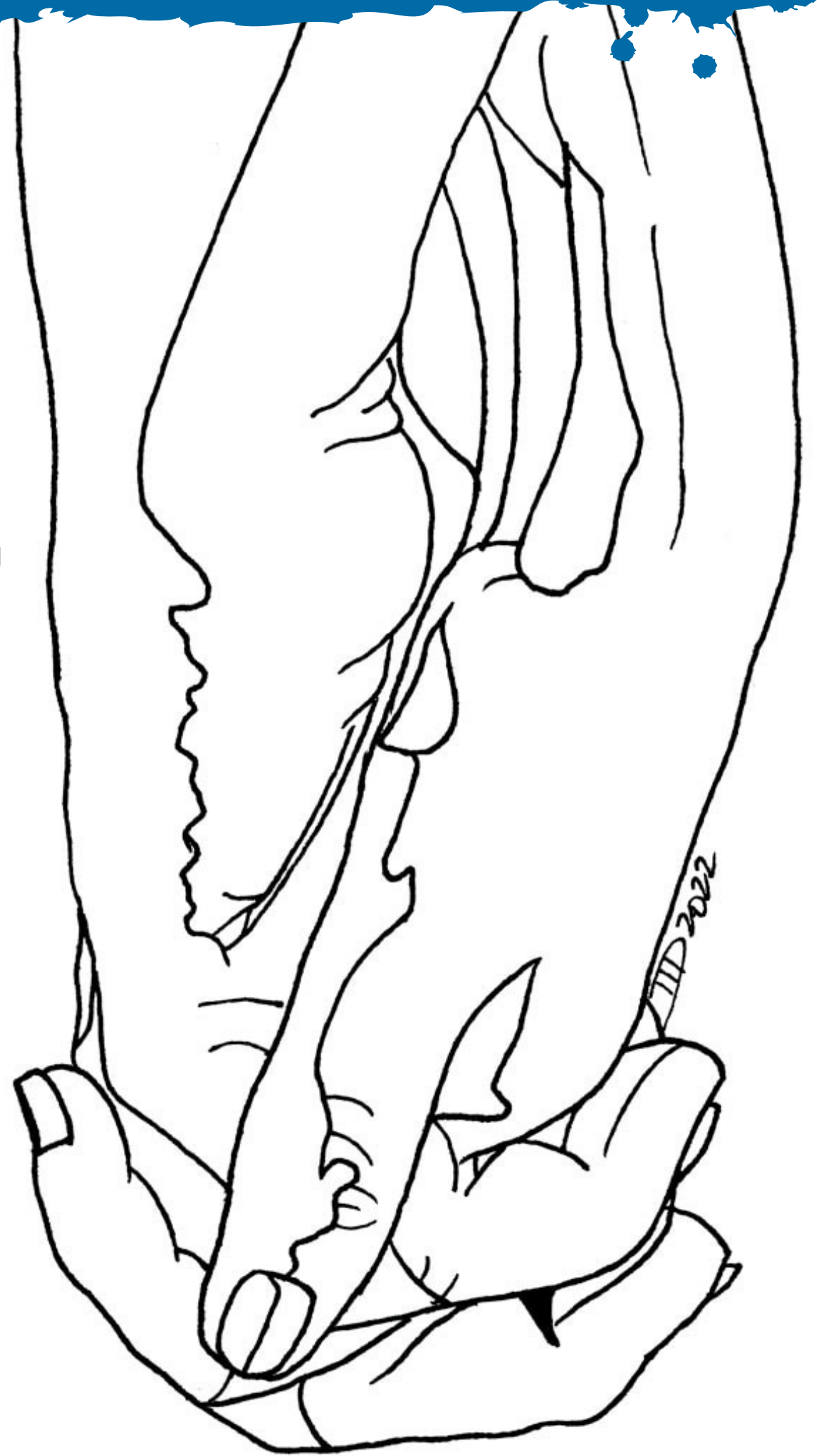
